Donations to ALGA are the lifeblood of much of ALGA's work, enabling, among other things, the refurbishment and fitout of ALGA's space at the Victorian AIDS Council (over \$50,000 in the past two years). *Secret Histories of Queer Melbourne* would never have been published without the generosity of individual donors, as well as City of Melbourne support. Major expenditures awaiting funding include a replacement photocopier and computer system, both now over six years old, and a commercially hosted website to enable more ambitious online presentations.

We thank the many donors who have already contributed this year, and remind those who make specific purpose donations for periodicals binding that replica certificates of acknowledgement will be sent to donors around August-September.

SHELVING WORK PHASE 3

The third and final phase of the plan to create extra shelving capacity in ALGA's space at the Victorian AIDS Council is due to occur in early June. This involves wall shelving in the basement (next to the compactus) plus two stacked plan cabinets for additional poster storage.

In the second half of 2011 a priority is the rehousing of ALGA's 3000+ book collection, currently in a member's house. These are expected to take up about a quarter of the compactus capacity.

THE PRINCE – RECOLLECTIONS

A biography published last year by Ross Honeywill of Australian playwright Jim McNeil (1935-1982) includes McNeill's precocious childhood observations of life in St Kilda in the last days of World War 2 – among them the Prince of Wales Hotel catering for a [male] homosexual clientele and homo-sex opportunities at the segregated St Kilda sea baths for American gay soldiers "on the hunt".
