BERT EDWARDS REMEMBERED

Our tribute to Ralph McLean in Bulletin 43 prompted an ALGA member to remind us that in a very different era, Bert Edwards (1888-1963) was re-elected to public office in 1948 having served a prison term with hard labour 1931-33 for a homosexual offence, amidst much public scandal. Adelaide writer and activist Ian Purcell wrote a play about Bert Edwards' prosecution, *King of the West End*, which was performed in Adelaide in 2008.
